To ensure that everyone enjoys a wonderful evening and that admission runs smoothly, please read and follow the instructions below carefully.

Eventim.Pass

Admission is only possible with the Eventim.Pass, which you can find in the Eventim.App under 'Tickets'. Detailed instructions for the Eventim.Pass can also be found here: www.eventim.de/campaign/pass?affiliate=GMD

The admission code is usually activated 24 hours before the concert, so don't worry if you can't see it yet. Please note that screenshots, printed barcodes or additional memory tickets will not be accepted at the entrance and admission will only work with the Eventim.App. Please ensure that your smartphone is sufficiently charged.

Please have your smartphone ready and open the Eventim.Pass app when you arrive so that ticket checks can be carried out as quickly as possible.

fanSALE

If your plans have changed and you are no longer able to attend the concert, please only use Eventim's fanSALE to sell your ticket safely and easily. Please note that tickets for wheelchair users and persons with severe disabilities are excluded from fanSALE.

SAFETY RESTRICTIONS

For safety reasons, it is prohibited to bring glass bottles, cans, hard packaging or other items that could be used as projectiles (e.g. deodorant, perfume, etc.) onto the premises. These items will therefore be confiscated at the entrance.

Bags only up to max. DIN A4 (21 cm x 29.7 cm)

The ban applies to bags and backpacks whose largest side is larger than the 'A4' format (21.0 x 29.7 cm).

In order to minimise waiting times at the entrance, we kindly ask concertgoers to refrain from bringing bags with them.

Admission will be granted with smaller bags (bum bags, small shoulder bags, clutches), but we ask you to limit yourself to the absolute minimum (e.g. money, medication). E-cigarettes are permitted.

To speed up admission, please leave the following items at home:

- Large bags such as backpacks, shopping bags, travel bags, suitcases, baskets and cool bags
- Professional cameras with interchangeable and/or zoom lenses and video function
- Audio and video recording devices of any kind
- Lighting and video equipment
- GoPro cameras
- Selfie sticks
- Electronic devices such as tablets and laptops, **with the exception of mobile phones and small power banks**
- Food and drinks (both available on the stadium grounds)
- Chairs
- Weapons, knives, tasers, batons, pepper spray, etc.
- Glass containers
- Torches, key rings, wallet chains, glow sticks, laser pointers
- Flags and posters (including sticks)
- Helmets
- Umbrellas of any kind
- Binoculars

GETTING THERE

We recommend travelling to and from the venue by public transport (except special transport services), as your concert ticket entitles you to use these services and parking spaces at the venue are limited. The Olympic Park is well connected to the MVG network.

Please note: You must book your local transport ticket as a combined ticket in an additional step. You will receive a separate email from Eventim in good time before the event. Without this additional (free) booking, you will not be able to use public transport. Both tickets (event ticket and travel pass) must be presented together during ticket inspections.

The Park&Ride facilities around Munich are particularly convenient for concert-goers travelling from outside the city: www.parkundride.de/parken.

Bus and train:

The Olympic Stadium can be reached by underground line U3 towards Moosach (Olympiazentrum stop). From there, it is about a 10-minute walk to the Olympic Park.

Visitors can also take tram lines 20 and 21 (Olympiapark West stop) or tram line 27 (Petuelring stop) and then walk about 5 minutes to the Olympic Park.

The Olympic Stadium can also be reached by city bus lines 144 (Spiridon-Louis-Ring, Olympiasee, and Olympiaberg stops), 173 (Olympiazentrum, Olympia-Eissportzentrum, and Petuelring stops) 177 and 178 (Petuelring stop).

Visitors can also take the S-Bahn line S1 towards Ostbahnhof, get off at Moosach, and from Moosach take the underground line U3 or U8 to Olympiazentrum, followed by a 10-minute walk to the Olympic Park, or take the S-Bahn line S8 towards Herrsching, Marienplatz stop, and from Marienplatz take the U3 underground line to Olympiazentrum, followed by a 10-minute walk to the Olympic Park.

Car:

Please note: Munich environmental zone – Parkharfe free!

Visitors to the Olympic Park can drive directly from the Mittlerer Ring (Landshuter Allee) via the Sapporobogen into the Parkharfe.

Those arriving by car can book a parking space in the Parkharfe using the new reservation system.

Simply go to www.rkb-parken.de in advance and reserve the desired day, time and planned duration of your stay on the home page.

After payment, you will receive a QR code with a wallet function, which you scan when you enter. Optionally, you can also enter your licence plate number, which will then be automatically recorded when you arrive to open the barrier. With both options, you will still receive the usual parking ticket when you enter, so that you can pay any additional fees at the ticket machines if you exceed the time limit.

Experience has shown that it can take up to an hour to exit the Parkharfe.

Parking harp at the Olympic Stadium: 25.00€/day

How to get there:

Coming from the A9 Berlin / Nuremberg:

Follow the motorway to the end, take the Mittlerer Ring West exit, head towards the Olympic Park until you reach the Lerchenauer Straße underpass (at the BMW Museum), then take the far right lane – turn right into the car park at the Olympiahalle.

Arriving from the A92 Deggendorf:

Follow the motorway until the end, take the Mittlerer Ring West exit, head towards Olympiapark until you reach the Lerchenauer Straße underpass (at the BMW Museum), then take the far right lane – turn right at the Olympiahalle to access the car park.

Arriving from the A94 Passau:

At the München Ost motorway junction, head towards Nürnberg until you reach the München Nord motorway junction. From there, head towards München until the end of the motorway, take the Mittlerer Ring West exit, head towards Olympiapark until you reach the Lerchenauer Straße underpass (at the BMW Museum), then take the far right lane – turn right into the car park at the Olympiahalle.

Coming from the A8 Salzburg / Innsbruck

Continue to the end of the motorway at Ramersdorf (do not take the A99 towards Giesing!), then turn right towards Olympiapark. On the Mittlerer Ring, follow the signs for Olympiapark/Autobahn Nürnberg until you reach the Lerchenauer Straße underpass (at the BMW Museum), then take the far right lane – turn right into the car park at the Olympiahalle.

Coming from the A95 Garmisch-Partenkirchen

Continue to the end of the motorway at Luise-Kieselbach-Platz, then turn half left onto Mittlerer Ring towards Olympiapark. Access to the car park is at the former cycling stadium.

Coming from the A96 Lindau:

Continue to the end of the motorway at Mittlerer Ring Nord, then continue on Mittlerer Ring towards Olympiapark/Autobahn Nürnberg. Access to the car park is at the former cycling stadium.

Coming from the A8 Stuttgart:

Continue straight ahead until the end of the motorway (Verdistr., which becomes Amalienburgstr. and Menzingerstr.) until you reach Wintrichring, then turn left towards Olympiapark/Autobahn Nürnberg. At Georg-Brauchle-Ring near the Olympic grounds, the road becomes four lanes – please move into the far right lane! The entrance to the car park is on the right-hand side at the football stadium, before the pedestrian bridge.

WHEELCHAIR USERS / PEOPLE WITH SEVERE DISABILITIES

Wheelchair users can access the Olympic Stadium via the **Kleine Marathontor** on the south-west side of the stadium.

There are disabled parking spaces for wheelchair users in the Olympic Park:

- Parking deck at the Olympic Tower – 6 parking spaces
- Parking harp at the Olympic Stadium – 20 spaces in block 1
- Car park at the Olympic Ice Sports Centre – 3 spaces

Toilets in the Olympic Stadium:

- In the Kleine Marathontor
- Near block M

FURTHER

For safety reasons, walking aids (walkers, crutches, walking sticks, walking frames or electric mobility scooters with walking aid function) are not permitted in the entire standing area. This rule also applies to standing places in the stands. White canes are exempt from this rule.

AWARENESS - Contact point – ‘Is Luisa there?’

If you feel uncomfortable, are being harassed, experience discrimination or are affected by inappropriate behaviour, you are not alone! Just ask, ‘Is Luisa there?’ – this code word gives you quick and discreet access to help. The awareness team is there to support you, whether you are dealing with anxiety, violence, sexual assault or other emergencies.

How can you reach the awareness team?

The awareness team is easily recognisable on site by their purple polo shirts and jackets with the awareness logo. Mobile awareness teams are on the move so that you can find support anytime, anywhere. They are there for you throughout the entire event – from admission until approximately 30 minutes after the show ends.

However, you can also contact the following people at any time:

- Security staff
- Service staff at the kiosks
- The on-site medical service

You can also find support at any time directly in the awareness area.

Location of the awareness area:

The awareness area is located at the first aid station directly next to the main grandstand. It offers you a protected retreat and trained contact persons who will respond to your needs – anonymously, confidentially and without pressure. Your needs and boundaries are always our top priority.

As a general rule, safety comes first

Remember to bring sun protection (sunscreen, headgear, etc.) and rainproof clothing.

Loud music can damage your hearing! We would like to point out that hearing protection and appropriate positioning on the premises are particularly important for children. We recommend that children under the age of 8 do not attend the concert; children under the age of 6 are NOT permitted to enter.

Paramedics and doctors will be on site for medical emergencies.

Please behave considerately at all times, be mindful of others and offer your help.

We apologise for any delays in the programme.

We hope you enjoy the concert.
